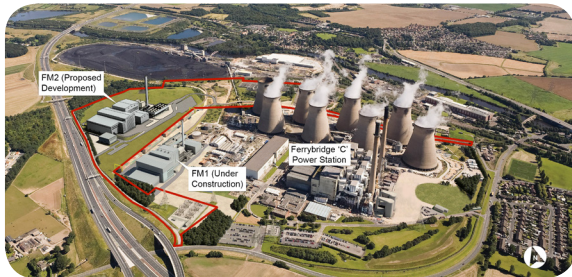


# Ferrybridge Multifuel 2 (FM2) Power Station



Multifuel Energy Ltd (MEL), a 50:50 joint venture between SSE plc and Wheelabrator Technologies Inc., is proposing to develop a second multifuel power station at Ferrybridge - known as Ferrybridge Multifuel 2 (FM2), next to the existing Ferrybridge Multifuel 1 (FM1) facility which is currently under construction. The power station will be capable of producing circa 70 megawatts (MW) net of low carbon electricity and heat, enough to supply around 160,000 homes\*. The energy will be produced by burning waste derived fuel from various sources of processed municipal solid waste, commercial and industrial waste and waste wood.

As FM2 will generate over 50MW of energy it is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project and requires a Development Consent Order (DCO) under the Planning Act 2008 to allow it to be constructed. The DCO application for FM2 was submitted to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), the Government Agency responsible for considering applications for DCO's in July 2014 and is seeking permission from the Secretary of State for Energy and Climate Change to develop the proposals. On 20 August 2014, PINS accepted the application for examination.

Now that the FM2 DCO has been accepted by PINS, the DCO application enters the pre-examination phase, which gives members of the public the opportunity to register their interest and participate in the public meetings by presenting their views on the proposals.
